PBS LearningMedia Workshop Series (Please Note: provided free-of-charge as a stand-alone offering, separately from PBS TeacherLine Online Courses)	Each PBS LearningMedia Workshop Series consists of a total of 5.5 hours of training delivered over a semester, including three 90-minute face-to-face workshops and one 1-hour online webinar. In addition to training time, participants also implement media-integration strategies into their teaching in order to share back with colleagues. Workshops 1-3 progress from Introductory to Intermediate to Advanced, as content moves from site navigation, to use of interactive tools and media integration strategies, to demonstration of classroom practice through the delivery of a sample lesson for constructive peer-review. The online interactive webinar session provides a check-in opportunity for participants to share updates, challenges, and ideas. All sessions are geared to the specific subject area/grade levels of participants.	Teachers, Library Media Specialists, Instructional Coaches	PBS LearningMedia Workshop Series are provided at the convenience of the requesting school or district, and are generally adapted into existing PD schedules, including in-school, afterschool, or summer. Workshops are facilitated by Rhode Island PBS Education Services staff (current or former certified K-12 educators), with guest curriculum and/or instructional technology experts. Rhode Island PBS has the capacity to deliver approximately 4-6 Workshop Series per year, at the rate of 1-2 per semester (Fall, Winter, Spring, and Summer).
PBS TeacherLine Online Courses (Please Note: provided on a fee-basis, as a stand-alone offering separately from PBS LearningMedia Workshop Series)	Each PBS TeacherLine Online Course is an intensive, facilitated online class requiring either 45-, 30- or 15- hours of coursework, representing the equivalent of 3-, 2- or 1- university credit hours respectively, delivered over a semester. Each course is facilitated by a Master's level or higher certified instructor, with multiple required assignments, resulting in a letter grade at the completion of the course. Approximately 75% of course offerings are 45-hours/3-credit hours, with the remaining 25% a mix of 30-/15-hours (2- or 1- credit hours).	Teachers, Administrators, Library Media Specialists, Instructional Coaches	PBS TeacherLine Online Courses are delivered on a rolling semester basis, with approximately 25 distinct courses offered 3-4 times per year (Fall, Winter, Spring, and Summer). Coursework is completed by participants on an asynchronous basis, with assignments completed by deadlines as set by the instructor.
